

ARTICLES OF FAITH

PREAMBLE

We believe the Bible to be inspired of God, the infallible Word of God. “All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness” (II Timothy 3:16).

The Bible is the only God-given authority, which man possesses; therefore, all doctrine, faith, hope, and all instruction for the church must be based upon, and harmonize with, the Bible. It is to be read and studied by all men everywhere, and can only be clearly understood by those who are anointed by the Holy Spirit (I John 2:27). “No prophecy of the Scripture is off any private interpretation. For the prophecy came not in old time by the will of man: but holy men of God spake as they were moved by the Holy Ghost” (II Peter 1:20, 21).

FUNDAMENTAL DOCTRINE

The basic and fundamental doctrine of Shiloh Restoration Tabernacle shall be the Bible standard of full salvation, which is repentance, baptism in water by immersion in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, and the baptism of the Holy Ghost, which is the initial sign of speaking with other tongues as the Spirit gives utterance.

We shall endeavor to keep the unity of the spirit, until we all come into the unity off the faith, at the same time admonishing all believers in that they shall not contend for their different views to do disunity off the body.

THE ONE TRUE GOD

We believe in the one-ever living, eternal God: infinite in power, holy in nature, attributes and purpose; and possessing absolute, indivisible deity. This one true God has revealed himself as father; through his son, in redemption; and as the Holy Spirit, by emanation (I Corinthians 8: six; Ephesians 4: six; II Corinthians 5: 19; Joel 2:28).

The Scripture does more than attempt to prove the existence of God; it asserts, assumes and declares that the knowledge of God is universal (Romans 1:19, 21, 28, 32: 2:15). God is in visible, incorporeal, without parts, without body, and therefore free of all limitations. He is spirit (John 4:24), and “a spirit hath not flesh and bones” (Luke 24:39).

“The first of all the commandments is ”Hear, O. Israel; The Lord our God is ONE Lord” (Mark 12:29; Deuteronomy 6:4). “One God and Father of all, who is above all, and through all, and in you all” (Ephesians 4:6).

Before the incarnation, this one true God manifested himself in diverse ways. In the incarnation, he manifested himself in the son, who walked among men. As he works in the lives of believers, he manifested himself as the Holy Spirit.

THE SON OF GOD

The one true God, the Jehovah of the Old Testament, took upon himself the form of man, and is the son of man, was born of the Virgin Mary. As Paul says, “and without controversy. Great is the mystery of godliness: God was manifested in the flesh, justified in the spirit, seen of Angels, preached on to Gentiles, believed on in the world, received up into glory” (I Timothy 3:16).

“He came on to his own, and his own received in not” (John 1:11). This one true God was manifested in the flesh, that is, in his son Jesus Christ. “God was in Christ, reconciling the world on to himself, not impute in their trespasses onto them” (II Corinthians 5:19).

We believe that, “in him (Jesus) to unless all the fullness of the Godhead bodily” (Colossians 2:9). “For it please the father that in him should all fullness dwell” (Colossians 1:19). Therefore, Jesus in his humanity was man; in his deity was and is God. His flesh was the lamb, or the sacrifice of God. He is the only mediator between God and man. “For there is one God, and one mediator Jean God and man, the man Christ Jesus” (I Timothy 2:5).

Jesus on his father's side was divine, on his mother's side, human; vast, he was known as the son of God, and also the son of man, or the God man.

“For he hath put all things under his feet. But when he say at all things are put under him, it is manifest that he is excepted, which did put all things under him” (I Corinthians 15:27). “And when all things shall be subdued onto him, then shall the son also himself the subject unto him, that put all things under him, that God may be all in all” (I Corinthians 15: 28).

“I am Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the end, saith the Lord, which is, and which was, and which is to come, the Almighty” (Revelation 1:8).

THE NAME

God used different titles, such as “God Elohim,” “God Almighty,” “El-Shaddai,” “Jehovah,” and especially “Jehovah Lord,” the redemptive name in the Old Testament.

“Unto us a child is born, unto us as son is given:... And his name shall be called Wonderful, Counselor, the Mighty God, the Everlasting Father, the Prince of Peace” (Isaiah 9:6). This prophecy of Isaiah was fulfilled when the son of God was named. “And she shall bring forth a son, and thou shalt call his name JESUS: for he shall save his people from their sins” (Matthew 1:21).

“Neither is there a salvation in any other: for there is none other name under heaven given among man, whereby we must be saved” (Acts 4:12).

CREATION OF MAN AND HIS FALL.

In the beginning God created man in assent, pure and holy; but through the sin of disobedience, at them and needs, the first of the human race, fell from their holy state, and God banished them from the. Hence by one man's disobedience, sin entered into the world (Genesis 1:27; Romans 3:23, 5:12).

REPENTANCE

Pardon and forgiveness of sins is obtained by genuine repentance, a confession and forsaking of sins. We are justified by faith in the Lord Jesus Christ (Romans 5:1). John the Baptist preached repentance, Jesus proclaimed it, and the apostles emphasized it to both Jews and Gentiles (Acts 2:38, 11:18, 17:30).

The word “repentance” means a change of use and purpose, change of heart, change of mind, change of life, transformation, etc.

Jesus said, “Except ye repent, ye shall all likewise perish” (Luke 13:3).

Luke 24:47 says, “and that repentance and remission of sins should be preached in his name among all nations, beginning at Jerusalem.”

WATER BAPTISM

The scriptural mode of baptism is immersion, and is only for those who have fully repented, having turned from their sins, and the love of the world. It should be administered by a duly authorized minister of the Gospel, in obedience to the Word of God, and in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ, according to the Acts off the apostles 2:38, 8:16, 10:48, 19:5; thus obeying and fulfilling Matthew 28:19.

THE BAPTISM OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

John the Baptist, in Matthew 3:11, said, “He shall baptize you with the Holy Ghost, and with fire.”

Jesus, in Acts 1:5, said, “Ye shall be baptized with the Holy Ghost, not many days hence.”

Luke tells us in Acts 2:4, “they were all filled with the Holy Ghost, and began to speak with other tongues [languages], as the Spirit gave them utterance.”

The terms “baptize with the Holy Ghost and fire,” “filled with the Holy Spirit,” and the “gift of the Holy Ghost” are synonymous terms used interchangeably in the Bible.

It is scriptural to expect all who received the gift, feeling, or baptism of the Holy Spirit to receive the same physical, initial sign of speaking with other tongues.

The speaking with other tongues, as recorded in Acts 2:4, 10:46, and 19:6, and the gift of tongues, as explained in I Corinthians, chapters 12 and 14, are the same in essence, but different in use and purpose.

The Lord, through the prophet Joel, said, "I will pour out of my spirit upon all flesh" (Joel 2:28).

Peter, in explaining his phenomenal experience, said, "having received out the father the promise of the Holy Ghost, he [Jesus] hat shed forth this, which he now see and hear" (Acts 2:33).

Further, "the promise is unto you and to your children, and to all that are afar off, even as many as the Lord our God shall call" (Acts 2:39).

DIVINE HEALING

The first covenant that the Lord (Jehovah) made with the children of Israel after they were brought out of Egypt was a covenant of healing. The Lord said, "if thou wilt diligently hearken to the voice of the Lord [Jehovah-Rapha, the Lord that healeth] thy God, and wilt do that which is right in his side, and wilt give ear to his commandments, and keep all its statutes, I will put none of these diseases upon be, which I have brought upon the Egyptians; for I am the Lord that healeth thee" (Exodus 15:26).

Our Lord Jesus Christ went about Galilee, preaching the gospel of the king down and see it and all manner of sickness and disease among the people (Matthew 4:23-24).

"Jesus Christ the same yesterday, and today, and forever" (Hebrews 13:8).

The vicarious suffering off the Lord Jesus Christ, paid not only for the salvation of our souls, but also for the sealing off or bodies. "With his stripes we are healed" (Isaiah 53:5). Matthew 8:17 reads, "himself took our infirmities, and bear our sicknesses." (See also I Peter 2:24.) We see from this and that divine healing for the body is in the atonement.

Jesus set of believers," they shall they hands upon the sake, and they shall recover." Later, James wrote in his epistle to all the churches: "is any say come on you? Let him call for the elders of the church; and that then pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord: and the prayer of faith shall save the sake, and the Lord shall raise him up; and if he hath committed sins, they shall be forgiven him. Confess your faults one to another, and pray for one another, that he may be sealed. The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man and availeth much" (James 5:14-16).

SACRAMENT OR COMMUNION

On the night of our Lord's betrayal, He ate the Passover supper with his apostles, after which he instituted the sacrament. "And he took bread, and gave thanks, and break it, and gave onto them, saying, this is my body which is given for you: this do in remembrance of me. Likewise also the cup after supper, saying, this cup is the New Testament in my blood, which is shed for you" (Luke 22:19-20).

Paul instructed the church how to observe it (I Corinthians 11:23-34).

Thus was instituted, the use of Latrobe bread, and the fruit off the vine, which are partaken of literally, as emblems off his broken body and shed blood. There is also a spiritual significance, and blessing in partaking of the sacrament.

FOOTWASHING

When the Passover supper was ended, we read in John 13:4-5, "he riseth from supper, and he laid aside his garments; and took a towel, and girded himself. After that he poureth water into a basin, and began to wash the disciple's feet, and to wipe them with the towel wherewith he was girded."

Jesus said, "if I then, your Lord and Master, have washed your feet; ye also ought to wash one another's feet. For I have given you an example, that he should do as I have done to you" (John 13:14-15).

This first example was given by our Lord, and it is a divine institution. It is well to follow his example and wash one another's feet; that's manifest in the spirit of humility.

HOLINESS

Godly live-in should characterize the life of every child of the Lord, and we should live according to the pattern and example given in the Word of God. "For the grace of God that bring us salvation hath appeared on to all men, teaching us that, denying godliness and worldly lusts, we should live soberly, righteously, and godly, in this present world" (Titus 2:11-12). "For even hereunto were ye called: because Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example, that ye should follow his steps, calling, who did not sin, neither was guile found in his mouth: who, when he was reviled, reviled, not again; in when he suffered, he threatened not; but committed himself to him, that judgeth righteously" (I Peter 2:21-23).

"Follow peace with all men, and Holiness, without which no man shall see the Lord" (Hebrews 12:14).

"But as he which hath called you is holy, so be ye holy in all a matter of compensation; because it is written, be ye holy; for I am holy. And if ye call on the father, who without respect of persons judgeth according to every man's work, pass the time of your sojourning here in fear: for as much as he know that ye were not redeemed with corruptible things, as silver and gold, from your feigned conversation received by

tradition from your father's; in, but with the precious blood of Christ, as of the dam without blemish and without spot" (I Peter 1:15-19).

We wholeheartedly disapprove of bar people indulging in any activities which are not conducive to good Christianity and godly living, such as theaters, dances, mixed bathing or swimming, women cut in their hair, makeup, any apparel that immodestly exposes the body, all worldly sports and amusements, and wholesome radio programs and music. Furthermore, because of display of all these evils on television, we disapprove of any of our people, having television sets in their homes. We admonish all of our people to refrain from any of these practices in the interest of spiritual progress and the soon coming of the Lord for his church.

THE GRACE OF GOD

"For the grace of God that bringeth salvation hath appeared to all men, teaching us that, denying ungodliness and worldly lusts, we should live soberly, righteously, and godly, in this present world." (Titus 2:11-12).

"For the law was given by Moses, but grace and truth came by Jesus Christ." (John 1:17).

"For by grace, are you saved through faith; and that not of your selves; it is the gift of God: not of works lest any man should boast" (Ephesians 2:8-9).

A Christian must walk with God and keep himself in the love of God (Jude 21) and in the grace of God. When a person transgresses and sins against God, and does not repent, he would eventually be lost and cast into the lake of fire. (See John 15:2, 6: II Peter 2:20-21.) Jude speaks of the backsliders of his day, and their reward. (See also Hebrews 6:4-6.)

RESTITUTION OF ALL THINGS

We understand, the scripture to teach as the "restitution of all things, which God hath spoken by the mouth of all his holy prophets since the world began." (Acts 3:21). But we can not find where the devil, his angels, and all sinners are included. (See Revelation 20:10).

CONSCIENTIOUS SCRUPLES

We recognize the institution of human governments as being of the divine ordination, and, in so doing, affirm unswerving loyalty to our government; however, we take a definite position regarding the bearing of arms or the taking of human life.

As followers of the Lord Jesus Christ, the Prince of Peace, we believe in implicit obedience to his commandments and precepts which instruct as follows: "that ye resist not evil" (Matthew 5:39); "Follow peace with all men" (Hebrews 12:14). (see also Matthew 26:52; Romans 12:19; James 5:6; Revelation 13:10.) These we believe and interpret to mean Christians shall not shed blood not take human life.

Therefore, we propose to fulfill all the obligations of loyal citizens, but are constrained to declare against participating in combatant service in war, armed insurrection, property destruction, aiding or abetting in or the actual destruction of human life.

Furthermore, we cannot conscientiously affiliate with any union, boycott, or organization which will force or bind any of its members to belong to any organization, perform any duties contrary to our conscience, or receive any mark, without our right to affirm or reject the same.

However, we reject the false impression created by some groups of so-called conscientious objectors that to obey the Bible is to have contempt for law or magistrates, to be disloyal to our Government and in sympathy with our enemies, or to be unwilling to sacrifice for the preservation of our commonwealth. This attitude would be as contemptible to us as to any patriot. The Word of God commands us to do violence to no man. It also commands us that first of all we are to pray for rulers of our country. We, therefore, exhort our members to freely and willingly respond to the call of our government, except in the matter of bearing arms. When we a service, we need service -- no matter how hard or dangerous. The true church has no more place for cowards than has the nation. First of all, however, let us earnestly pray that we will with honor be kept out of war.

We believe that we can be consistent in serving our government in certain non-combatant capacities, but not in the bearing of arms.

We further believe that our military personnel must live in a manner consistent with the Articles of Faith.

SECRET SOCIETIES, ETC.

According to the Word of God, we firmly believe and hold that the people of God should have no connection whatever with secret societies or any other organization or body wherein there is a fellowship with unbelievers, bound by an oath (James 5:12, II Corinthians 6:14-18).

TRANSLATION OF SAINTS

We believe that the time is drawing near when our Lord shall appear; then the dead in Christ shall arise, and we who are alive and remain shall be caught up with them to meet our Lord in the air (I Thessalonians 4:13-17; I Corinthians 15:51-54; Philippians 3:20-21).

MARRIAGE AND DIVORCE

“Whosoever shall put away his wife, except it be for fornication, and shall marry another, committeth adultery” (Matthew 19:9). (See also Matthew 5:32.) When this sin has been committed, the innocent party may be free to remarry only in the Lord. Our desire being to raise a higher standard for the ministry, we recommend that ministers do not marry again.

Judgment begins at the house of God.

TITHING

We believe tithing is God’s financial plan to provide for His work, and has been since the days of Abraham. Tithing came with faith under Abraham; Moses’ law enjoined it, and Israel practiced it when she was right with God; Jesus indorsed it (Matthew 23:23); and Paul said to lay by in store as God has prospered you. Do not rob God of His portion, viz., tithes and offerings. (Read Malachi 3.)

SECOND COMING OF JESUS

That Jesus is coming again the second time in person, just as He went away, is clearly set forth by the Lord Jesus Himself, and was preached and taught in the early Christian church by the apostles; hence, the children of God today are earnestly, hopefully, looking forward to the glorious event (Matthew 24; Acts 1:11, 3:19-21; I Corinthians 11:26; Philippians 3:20-21; I Thessalonians 4:14-17; Titus 2:13-14).

THE MILLENIUM

We believe that the distress upon the earth is the "beginning of sorrows" and will become more intense till there" (Matthew 24:3-8; Daniel 12:1), and that period of “tribulation” will be followed by the dawn of a better day on earth and that for a thousand years there shall be “peace on earth and good will toward men.” (See Revelation 20:1-5; Isaiah 65:17-25; Matthew 5:5; Daniel 7:27; Micah 4:1-2; Hebrews 2:14; Romans 11:25-27.)

FINAL JUDGMENT

When the thousand years are finished, there shall be a resurrection of all the dead, who will be summoned before the great white throne for their final judgment, and all whose names are not found written in the book of life shall be cast into the lake of fire, burning with brimstone, which God hath prepared for the devil and his angels, Satan himself being cast in first (Matthew 25:41; Revelation 20:7, 15; 21:8).

PUBLIC SCHOOL ACTIVITIES

We disapprove of school students attending shows, dance is, dancing classes, theaters, engaging in school activities against their religious scruples, and wearing gymnasium clothes which a modestly exposed of the body.

We disapprove of school students being forced to take coeducation classes, which involve boys and girls being a together in swimming, calisthenics, baseball, and other mixed athletics, while clothed in ungodly attire, which in modestly exposes the body.

We disapprove of school students being forced to any taxes, in which, under the guise of health classes, sex education is taught to coeducationally or films or lectures are given that promote amoral or unnatural behavior.

We disapprove of school students being forced to be taught by or listen to those who promote or advocate sexual activity of any kind other than that within the bonds of the marriage relationship of husband and wife.

RELIGIOUS HOLIDAYS

Since the founding of the church occurred on that Day of Pentecost, Pentecost Sunday is also a recognized religious holiday.

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
